PRESENTATION

There was a presentation by Brett Hanson, from the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency. He clarified the IEPA standards for water quality and how the City of Freeport measures against those standards.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The Journal of the Minutes of the regular meeting held on February 3, 2003, was presented for approval. Alderwoman Bender moved, seconded by Alderwoman Moore-Howard for approval of the minutes. The motion carried.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 1456 DANGEROUS AND UNSAFE BUILDINGS OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF FREEPORT

Corporation Counsel, Sarah Griffin and advising attorney did not agree that this was unconstitutional and that the ordinance was appropriate as written. There were no changes recommended for the ordinance. This ordinance was laid over from the meeting of February 3, 2003, when it was moved by Alderwoman Steele, seconded by Alderwoman Bender. ORDINANCE #2003-12

SPECIAL ORDINANCE FOR VARIATION, PERMIT, OR AMENDMENT OF CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF FREEPORT, ILLINOIS (Variance, 1628 W Harrison St)

Alderwoman Steele, Community Development Chair stated that the committee held a meeting on February 10, 2003. This variance is to allow the roof of a new garage to exceed the allowed amount by seven feet. There were no objections received and the variance is requested so that the roofline will be able to match the roofline of the existing house. RESOLUTION #R-2003-05 AS AMENDED

RESOLUTION TO APPROVE THE TIF APPLICATION POLICY

WHEREAS, the City of Freeport wishes to encourage the creation of new businesses in the City of Freeport; and

WHEREAS, the City is authorized to take certain actions pertaining to development and redevelopment activities; and

WHEREAS, Illinois Law provides for creation of a Tax Increment Finance (TIF) District to provide such assistance, intervention and redevelopment planning; and

WHEREAS, in order to ensure that the City has the necessary information available to it in order to determine feasibility and viability of any project seeking funding or reimbursement through a formal redevelopment agreement, the City has developed a TIF Application Checklist which is attached herein as Exhibit A.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FREEPORT, ILLINOIS that it approve the attached Tax Increment Financing Program Application Checklist to be used when seeking TIF funding through a redevelopment agreement.

RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE PARTICIPATION IN THE NATIONAL PHARMACEUTICAL STOCKPILE DISTRIBUTION PLAN FOR NORTHWEST ILLINOIS

WHEREAS, the nation, state and local region are all preparing for the potential of an act of bioterrorism; and

WHEREAS, as part of this preparedness, local public health officials have determined the "National Pharmaceutical Stockpile Distribution Plan for Northwest Illinois"; and

WHEREAS, the Freeport Police Department is an active participant in this plan.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FREEPORT, ILLINOIS that the Chief of Police of the Freeport Police Department is hereby designated as the authorized representative of the City of Freeport and is authorized to consent to the terms of such plan.

PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE

Alderman Dawson, Chair, stated that the committee held a meeting on February 12, 2003. The committee approved the sale of the fire department's old ladder truck.

PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE

Alderman Jenkins, Chair, stated that the committee held a meeting on February 10, 2003. Public Works Director, Craig Lebaron, showed drawings and informed the committee on the progress of the Galena Ave project. This is the section of Galena from Clark to South Street. The committee was pleased to see the improvements planned for the intersection of Empire, Fruit, and Galena. The streets will be aligned better and visibility will be greatly improved.

Roxanne Rice, from Rockford, Illinois, is requesting new curb for the rental property, 1436 West American, which at the corner of American and Stewart. The committee has been discussing whether curb and gutter should be added to the sidewalk program or if it should be separate. One attractive option discussed is to split the cost with the property owner, cost could range from \$20-\$30 per foot. This subject will be on next month's regular meeting agenda.

Denise Blakely, Assistant Director of the Water & Sewer Department, discussed the request from the W & S Commission to spend \$91,0000 on a rate study plan for storm sewer improvements. The committee wants assurance that Black & Veatch is uniquely qualified and that the cost is reasonable, and what the impact could be for homeowners and businesses in Freeport.

The next meeting will be March 10, 2003, at 7:00pm, in City Council Chambers.

TECHNOLOGY COMMITTEE

Alderman Gaulrapp, Chair, announced that the next meeting would be March 4, 2003, in City Council Chambers.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

Alderwoman Steele, Chair, stated that the committee held a meeting on February 10, 2003. An ordinance with regard to banning smoking in public locations was presented

as a draft for review. This ordinance bans smoking in all public places with exceptions to bars, motel/hotel rooms, private homes, tobacco shops, or private clubs. This will be discussed further at the next regularly scheduled meeting on March 3, 2003.

Mayor Gitz addressed the committee seeking opinions on a possible ordinance with restrictions for political signage. The size of the signs, removal after election, and signage in public right of ways were items discussed with reference to this topic. The committee was told to expect a draft ordinance at the next meeting.

The committee also held a special meeting on February 18, 2003. Bids were presented for five properties. They will be presented at the next council meeting.

FINANCE COMMITTEE

Alderman Bush, Chair, stated that the committee held a meeting on February 11, 2003. The members of the Financial Task Force presented their recommendations to the committee. They recommended cutting \$1.3 million dollars in expenses increase revenues to \$605,000, which included increasing the Telecommunications Tax to 3% and other taxing options. Several people in attendance voiced their concern on possible cuts to the police and fire departments. The committee will discuss increasing the telecommunications tax at a special meeting on February 19, 2003, at 6:00pm.

Bill Morris discussed a bond for the library project, storm sewers, and the Rawleigh redevelopment project. He explained that a \$6 million dollar bond would pay for all three projects. He stated that the first payment would be minimal, but it would increase over time.

The committee was informed that the police department would be requesting bids for a cleaning service. Alderman Bush announced that there would be a special meeting on February 19, 2003, at 6:00pm, in City Council Chambers.

NEW BUSINESS

The aldermen made comments. There was no new business presented that required action from the council.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Debbie Doelker made comments regarding Vision 20/20 and a FOIA request that was submitted to the Water and Sewer Department.

DeEsta Munz requested that citizens write if they are interested in saving the Germania Club.

Mayor Gitz made comments regarding various city issues.

As there was no other business to be transacted by the City Council, the meeting was adjourned at 8:12pm.
