## RESOLUTION #R-2006-02

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING APPLICATION FOR PUBLIC TRANSPORTAION FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE UNDER SECTION 5311 OF THE FEDERAL TRANSIT ACT OF 1964, AS AMENDED (49 U.S.C. 5311)

WHEREAS, the provision of public transit service is essential to the transportation of persons in the non-urbanized area; and

WHEREAS, Section 5311 of the Federal Transit Act of 1964, as amended

(49 U.S.C. § 5311), makes funds available to help offset certain operating deficits of a system providing public transit service in non-urbanized areas; and

WHEREAS, grants for said funds will impose certain obligations upon the recipient, including the provision by it of the local share of funds necessary to cover costs not covered by funds provided under section 5311 of the Federal Transit Act of 1964, as amended (49 U.S.C. § 5311).

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FREEPORT:

Section 1. That an application be made to the Division of Public Transportation, Department of Transportation, State of Illinois, for a financial assistance grant under Section 5311 of the Federal transit Act of 1964, as amended (49 U.S.C. § 5311), for the purpose of offsetting a portion of the Public Transportation Program operating deficits of The City Council of the City of Freeport.

Section 2. That while participating in said operating assistance program the City of Freeport will provide all required local matching funds.

Section 3. That the Mayor of the City of Freeport is hereby authorized and directed to execute and file on behalf of the City of Freeport such application.

Section 4. That the Mayor of the City of Freeport is authorized and directed to furnish such additional information as may be required by the Division of Public Transportation and the Federal Transit Administration in connection with the aforesaid application for said grant.

Section 5. That the Mayor of the City of Freeport is hereby authorized and directed to execute and file on behalf of the City of Freeport all required Grant Agreements with the Illinois Department of Transportation, in order to obtain grant assistance under the provisions of the Section 5311 of the Federal Transit Act of 1964, as amended (49 U.S.C. § 5311).

Section 6. That the Mayor of the City of Freeport is hereby authorized to provide such information and to file such documents as may be required to perform the Grant Agreement and to receive the grant.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOVED** that all resolutions or parts of resolutions in conflict with this Resolution are repealed insofar as they conflict.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that this Resolution is passed under the home Rule Authority of the City of Freeport as provided in Section 6 of Article VII of the Illinois Constitution of 1970.

Alderman Boldt stated that the committee of the whole held a meeting on January 3, 2006. The committee voted unanimously to adopt this resolution with the amendment that granting funds would be approved by the committee of the whole before issued and Alderman Boldt so moved, seconded by Alderwoman Bender.
