Freeport's 2022 Chicago Streetscape Project Earns Major Illinois Award

The City of Freeport, Greater Freeport Partnership, and Fehr Graham earned an Illinois Main Street award for their collaborative design on the Chicago Avenue Streetscape Project in 2022. The Chicago Avenue Streetscape Project was one of 3 design projects from the state of Illinois that received the design award. Since project and infrastructure improvement completion, all storefronts along Chicago Avenue have been filled. Four building owners have made substantial investments in their buildings.

As we wrap up the year and approach the holidays, I cannot help but reflect on the accomplishments and impactful moments for the City and our community.

This year, our Public Works crews operated on a level of excellence, conducting in-house paving projects at a pace and skill level unseen by previous administrations. Our crews paved nearly 5 times the amount of hot mix than any year in recent history... ...continued

... allowing us to put our city-owned paver to good use and improve many streets throughout the city. Streets like Chicago Avenue, Center, Empire, and plenty more all benefited from the great work of city crews. That work is paired with the excellent work of our contracted partners on larger projects like Adams Avenue, which will continue into 2024. Over the past three years, the city has improved 11.5 miles of Freeport streets, and we hope to improve more than 4.5 miles next year.

City-led projects for next year's street program are extensive. Streets like Iroquois from Galena to Kenwood, Chicago Avenue from Galena to Jackson, Oak from Galena to South, Ridge from Park to Wood, 13th Ave from Shawnee and La Salle are just a few of the many street repairs you will see in 2024. This list is in addition to the contractor led projects already in motion like Adams Avenue Reconstruction, Pearl City Road, and Bradmar and Towne Drive. We hope to announce plenty more in the new year.

I wish you all a wonderful holiday season. Let love and kindness your motivation in all you do and together we can show the world that Freeport is a great place to live, work and play!

Snow Emergency & Odd-Even Parking Explained



As winter approaches, it is critical that Freeport residents follow the protocols for vehicle parking during snow emergencies. During snow emergencies, the City requires residents to follow an alternative parking procedure:

Vehicles should be parked on the "even numbered" side of the street in the City on the "even-numbered" day of each month. Vehicles should be parked on the "odd-numbered" side of the street on an "odd-numbered day of the month.



Park on the "oddnumbered" side of the street on "odd-numbered days" like the 1st, 3rd, and 5th day of the month Park on the "evennumbered" side of the street on "even-numbered days" like the 2nd, 4th, and 6th day of the month

Vehicles found in violation of the above parking regulations may be towed at the vehicle owner's expense.

Parking in driveways, observing even/odd parking protocols, removing vehicles from downtown streets, and municipal parking lots significantly contribute to City Street Crew's ability to safely and effectively conduct snow removal operations.



Many hallmarks of the holiday season, including Christmas trees, holiday decorations, cooking and baking, present potential fire hazards that contribute to home fires during the winter months. Freeport Fire Department wants every family to have a safe and happy holiday season. Follow these tips to keep the winter holidays safe for all of your family and friends:

When decorating, remember:

- Be careful with holiday decorations. Choose decorations that are flame resistant or flame retardant.
- Keep lit candles away from decorations and other things that can burn. Better yet, use battery operated candles instead.
- Check lights some are indoor use only, some are outdoor use only, and some are both. Be sure you are using the correct lights.
- Replace any string of lights with worn or broken cords or loose bulb connections. Read manufacturer's instructions on the correct number of light strands that are safe to connect together.
- Use clips made for light hanging, not nails or staples, keeping cords from becoming damaged.
- Keep decorations away from windows and doors ensuring a clear path of escape in case of fire.
- Turn off all lights and blow out all candles before leaving your home or going to bed.

Did You Know: more than 1/3 of home decoration fires are started by candles

Mayor Jodi Miller Elected to National League of Cities Board

In November, Freeport Mayor Jodi Miller was elected to the National League of Cities (NLC) Board of Directors. Only 26 elected officials across the country are elected to serve 2-year terms as atlarge members of the board. Mayor Miller is the first Freeport mayor to be elected to this national leadership position, and only one of two elected officials representing Illinois communities.

"I look forward to representing Freeport on the national stage," says Mayor Jodi Miller. "The National League of Cities advocates for federal policies that impact our community, and I'm honored to be a voice for Freeport."

The NLC is an organization that comprises of city, town, and village leaders that are focused on improving the quality of life for their current and future constituents. It represents over 2,700 communities across the nation. Its mission is to relentlessly advocate for, and protect the interests of cities, towns, and villages by influencing federal policy, strengthening local leadership, and driving innovative solutions.

Freeport Police Department's Drug Take-Back Event Results

In October, the Freeport Police Department collected over 39 pounds of prescription drugs during their Drug Take-Back Event. These collection events prevent prescription drugs from falling into the wrong hands and help residents safely dispose of drugs, no questions asked.
